Toledo Gem and Rockhound Club Board Meeting; August 13, 2018

President Clevenz called the meeting to order at 6:07pm

Secretary Report – Kathy made a motion to accept. Steve seconded it. Motion passes.

Treasurer Report – All of the work group funds are in the black at this time and the Club has a balance on hand in both liquid and investment accounts. In response to a query from Tom Barnhizer, Steve provided a balance of funds that the club has available in liquid assets. The Clubs Certificate of Deposit comes available in September whereupon it will be rolled over. Amy Shufeldt motioned to approve. Tom B seconded. Motion passed.

Old Business

A. 501c3 Application.

A meeting is scheduled September 22nd to collect information that must accompany the application and again at the Craft Center on 4 pm September 29th for the final completion and submittal.

B. IRS Form 1023 will be filed by end of September 2018. There is a \$600.00 filing fee, and 180 days waiting period after filing for processing. February is the expected date of organization.

C. The board has agreed that there is no need for us to hire a lawyer to complete the application process as it will be done by volunteers at no cost to the Club for time or services.

D. Once our application has been approved we will be notified of the need to change the existing Bylaws.

New Business

A. Property proposal from Jerri Herr – Handout of her proposal for the Culley Road property

Mrs Herr has sold \$3000.00 rock stock already. Need renovation and extension on the front. May need to remove walls. Long skinny acre lot.

Current issues were identified.

- Remove a lot of trees 12 big ones. Estimate of \$7,000.
- \$6,000 estimated for water service.
- \$5,000 for estimated for sewer service.
- Update electric no estimate available.

- ADA restrooms men's and women's are both needed.
- No storm door w/o walkway.
- We would need to sell the remaining rocks to retire debt.
- We wouldn't have to deal with a bank.
- If something happens to Jerri, what happens to the mortgage?
- Temporary storage units to sell.
- Permits required for most of the big items.

Amy Shufelt made a motion to accept the proposal as written by Jerri. Steve seconded. Motion failed to receive a majority of votes by the Board.

B. Setting guidelines for Moderators – Machines are getting ruined due to lack of proper guidance and lack of attention.

It has come to the board's attention that there are serious safety issues happening in the craft center. Written rules are not being followed. People are not always showing up to the mini groups. 3 people minimum, not including the moderators. Moderators can't work on programs.

It's the moderators that aren't following the rules. Written warnings will be sent out. Emails will be sent out about improper use of equipment. List what is expected of moderator (again).

Board will adopt the procedures below:

- Keep a written record of all verbal warnings given out.
- And one of written warning.
- Then sanction by the board. Demonstrate knowledge of workings.
Suspension from group.

Amy made a motion to create a 'laundry list' of policies and procedures for the moderators. If not enforced correctly, 1st 2nd warnings to be determined by the board. Tom seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Amy made a motion to send a notification to the membership about the situation with the equipment. Steve seconded it. Motion passed.

D. Amy Shufeldt - Addressing the Board

Amy is resigning as member of board do to medical issues. The board accepted her resignation.

Katherine S mentioned to the board to start thinking about potential candidates for lifetime membership.

Adjournment. Amy made her final motion as a board member to end the meeting. Kathy seconded it. At 7:43p the meeting ended.

Field Trip Report: Lakeport State Park, Port Huron, Michigan

I recently discovered the above webpage designed for Rockhounds who are looking for locations where they can find and collect new specimens. I was interested in finding locations that were near my home or areas that I planned to be traveling. **Findingrocks.com** offers a very simple to use system that quickly identifies hundreds of sites in nearly every State in the U.S. including some areas of Canada and Mexico. As many Rockhounds quickly discover not every State or region is equally blessed with sites containing interesting or diverse geologic materials. **Findingrocks.com** saves Rockhounds time by pin pointing both specific rocks and minerals along with directions to their near exact location. Detailed information on any local restrictions and conditions are also provided. Equipped with buckets, rakes and small shovels we quickly found that the beach was so full of colorful and interesting collectible material that we were a bit overwhelmed. We were surprised to discover that we were having to repeatedly discard many rocks that we had collected earlier in favor of better specimens. The water was warm on this late Summer day and we waded in up to our knees amazed at the colorful cobbles and pebbles that lay about the gently sloping shoreline extending up onto the sandy beach above the cresting waves. After a few hours we loaded up our findings onto our wagon and returned to our campsite to wait out the hot afternoon Sun. That evening and for the next two days we returned to the shoreline and each time came back with many specimens that we will be working with for many months to come.

Rockhounding can be pretty challenging sometimes so it is very pleasing to discover a tool that can make it both exciting and enjoyable. So if you are looking for a specific rock or mineral specimen or just want to find out what has been found by other hobbist you can't go wrong when you check out Findingrocks.com.

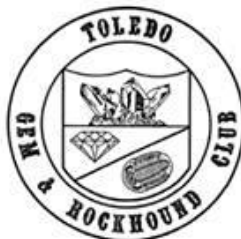
