In Rememberance by Diane Bieber

On Sunday, June 27, we lost a very devoted TGRC member, Ed Reynolds.

Ed was born in 1948 in Gatliff, KY. He was a descendant of Daniel Boone and also a distant relative of actor Burt Reynolds. He joined the club over forty years ago. Over time he was a moderator for every satellite group. He went to the schools and scout meetings to educate and enlighten young people about geology. He could repair any machine the club had. He was always ready to help a member with theirs too.

He worked claims in Arizona and New Mexico. One of his fluorite specimens that he mined in Bingham NM, he donated to New Mexico Tech University in Socorro, NM.

He was a rock and gem vendor for years. You could spot him immediately at our shows. He was the guy with all the tables next to the staircase wearing the black cowboy hat. He also did shows in Missouri, Indiana, Michigan and Ohio. Of course he needed mineral specimens for these shows. Many of the minerals he sold, he mined himself. He obtained apatite and sodalite from Bancroft, Ontario; flint, celestite and calcite from Ohio; geodes and arrowheads from Kentucky; quartz from Arkansas; and Herkimer diamonds from New York just to name a few of his exploits. His favorite places to shop were Quartzite, AZ in January when they have a huge rock swap and the Tucson Gem Show in February.

When he mined a mineral, he would pull it out of the hole he dug, look at it and say 'that mineral has been growing in this earth over a million years and I am the first person to lay eyes on it'.

His eyes would light up and you could feel his passion whenever he spoke about minerals. He showed people how to take a trip while sitting in their chair. He would hand them a magnifying glass and tell them to slowly examine the specimen while pointing out the various crystals that couldn't be seen with the naked eye.

His knowledge of minerals was mind blowing. He would look at a mineral, identify it and even tell you its country of origin.

Ed never met a stranger, only friends. He will be missed.

Memorial to Edward Reynolds

My first exposure to TGRC was at the 1994 Show. My first contact was Ed. I had come with my four kids as a "Science Lesson" for my homeschooling. Ed was running the Silent Auction, and my kids were fascinated with the sparkly rocks they could buy for as little as 10 cents. As a bonus, those rocks came with that Science Lesson, taught by our own Ed Reynolds. I had to go home for a wagon to carry it all back!

Ed described the benefits of the club so well that we joined on the spot. My kids became Juniors, I learned cabbing and silversmithing from him. I was so enamored with the club, that Ed talked me into becoming Show Chair, and sly dog that he was, he convinced me that it was a five year commitment. Boy, did he sucker me in! But really, I loved the energy of the Show so much, that I stuck it out for many more years than that. Im still doing it over 25 years later.

That was Ed's gift. In addition to being the most knowledgeable, self taught geologist I've ever known, he drew people in to the hobby. He helped anyone who was interested to love the hobby as much as he did. He constantly gave to the club, providing the kids kit materials for years. I know he and his family spent many hours every year packing little specimens so that kids of all ages could get a start in the hobby.

After joining, Ed convinced me to start going on field trip with him as my guide. Back then we had trips virtually every weekend from March to November. Ed taught what to look for, how to "read the rock" dig specimens out safely, identify them and more. On my first trip, I asked lots of questions, brought him a piece and asked him what it was. He said: "That's a leaverite, it's no good just leaver right there". What a character!

Because of his devotion to the club, Ed was made a lifetime member. His tireless support helped make the club what it is today. He will be sorely missed by myself and many other longtime members who cannot help but remember him fondly.

For Your Information

Proposal to align TGRC membership with our fiscal year

To align our TGRC membership with our Jan to Dec fiscal year, it is proposed to prorate the months of September to Dec at \$2.50/month plus tax for individuals or family\$4.50/month plus tax for family memberships. Thus, a September individual renewal or new membership would be \$30 + \$7.50 or \$37.50 plus tax. The membership would run from September of the current year to December of the following year.

Those wishing to join the club between October 1 and Dec 31 would be assessed \$2.50 per month for individuals or \$4.50 per month for families plus the regular membership fee—taking their memberships through the end of the following year.

The language for the bylaw change proposed is:

ARTICLE VI - MEMBERSHIP AND DUES

Section 4 - Dues are payable by December 31 each year and run from Jan. 1 to Dec. 31 the following calendar year. A member shall be dropped if dues are not paid by Dec. 31 when their membership expires.

Those wishing to join the club between October 1 and Dec 31 would be assessed \$2.50 per month for individuals or \$4.50 per month for families plus the regular membership fee—taking their memberships through the end of the following year.

Board Meeting Minutes 06/09/21



- 2. Secretary Report Jerri Minutes reviewed. Motion made by Angela, second by Glen to approve, motion carried.
- 3. Show Update Jerri relayed current dealer levels of 130 tables. Next Show Committee meeting June 22 at 7 PM. Arrangements moving ahead.
- 4. Treasurer Glen
- a. Report Checking: \$3428.85, Savings: \$26504.76. Menards credit and ATT credit still in assets. More detailed report will be given at General meeting. Jerri made a motion to accept report, Angela seconded. Motion carried.
- 5. Class Results
- a. Surfite class was almost full. Michelle had 4 students in her pendant class. Bracelet class also did well. Wax class in July has 4 signed up.
- b. Michelle asked for clarification of handling class fees, club vs instructor portion, specifically related to recouping materials fees. Discussed that Instructor getting paid by club check will not fall under \$100 limitation, because it is a pass through, not an expense. How it is handled is up to the instructor, either collect separate amounts from students, or all paid to club and Check written from club to instructor for their reimbursement.

- 12. Discussed membership policy regarding early membership start with upcoming Show. In the past have offered a few free


