

April 5- Texturing metal with a rolling mill and plates, bracelet blank \$4

April 7 & 9- Enameling, copper findings and enamels provided for \$7

April 12 & 14- Etching metal designs, copper blank \$4

April 19 & 21- Piercing designs in metal, sawing skills metal blank \$4

April 23- Open session no skill teaching (pendant class running that day)

April 26 & 28- Dapping, doming and using stakes to create a fluted cuff, bracelet blank provided \$4

May 3, 5- Fabricating hollow metal beads, using a disc cutter

May 7- Using shot plates for accent flowers and more to add to your jewelry

May 12, 19, 26- textured stacking rings, copper provided \$4

May 24- Making twisted wire, copper wire provided \$3

May 28- Using molds in the hydraulic press


