FACETERS

Faceting is the process of putting many flat, highly polished surfaces on a gemstone. Members of this group meet to learn, view each other's work and to discuss new patterns.

BEADERS

Beading provides members the opportunity to learn to make jewelry and other fashion items from regular beads, seed beads, and pearls. Our methods include loom weaving, embroidery, and stringing. Patterns are provided and project books are available. No equipment is necessary and basic supplies are provided to the novice. The EXTREME BEADERS are for advanced skills.

METALCRAFTERS



Make jewelry. New members are given instruction in the basic fabrication skills; soldering, sawing, and filing. After that, members branch out and develop their own styles. Current interests include piercing, precious metal clay, woven chaining, and general silversmithing. Share knowledge and discover new geologic specimens with other club members. We are in the heart of Devonian fossil country.

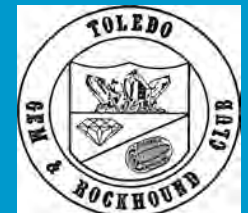
