Workshops

Make an Inlaid Ring Class -

Saturday Oct 4 (2 spaces available) or Oct 18 (2 spaces available) from noon to 3 pm. Participants will learn how to inlay crushed turquoise and metal shavings into a stainless steel ring. This involves using CA glue and crushed turquoise (courtesy of Diane Bieber). You will hand file the inlay till smooth and then sand/grind to a high polish. To register, contact instructor Michelle Grigore at mgrigoretgrh@gmail.com and specify the date you will attend. Please provide ring size for several fingers and I will try to match the closest purchased inlay ring band. Each class is limited to 5 students. Members pay \$30, non-members \$45. All materials are provided to complete a stainless steel and turquoise inlay band.

This year marked the return of live gem and jewelry crafting demonstrations. Representatives from The Ohio Department of Natural Resources joined the show to highlight natural wonders in the Buckeye State. Our own "What's My Rock?" service was supported by the Bowling Green State University Geology Club, searching for clues to identify mystery rocks.

TGRC members stepped up. Treasures Unearthed Co-Chair Jerri Heer, who is involved in shows around the country, says "The level of participation by Club members was phenomenal!" More than 50% of Toledo Gem and Rockhound Club (TGRC) membership participated as volunteers, vendors or demonstrators. The shared support highlights our members' dedication. The more members who volunteer means less work for everybody.

For the Club's part, 16 TGRC display cases exhibited Club members' many skills and talents. TGRC Club custom t-shirts and other apparel moved well. The Family Fun area gave rising young rockhounds hands-on opportunities with gem trees and treasure hunts. The updated UV display "Cave of Secrets" impressed many young visitors and their young-at-heart parents and grandparents.

Vendor participation was also good with 36 vendors sharing their wares throughout Pratt Pavillion. The consensus is that overall, it was a good show with a notable variety of vendors. Door prizes, generously donated by the vendors, and the Scholarship Raffle, featuring marvelous, member-made treasures, kept the show lively and visitors engaged in the fun.

Treasures Unearthed, like many special-interest shows, faced challenging financial headwinds because of current economic uncertainties. Nationally, impulse buying is down. Nevertheless, Treasures Unearthed matched last year's attendance figures and the show's income improved. As Jerri reported, "We held our own."

In the midst of all the dedicated work, a lot of TGRC Members found treasures of their own at Treasures Unearthed. Members are encouraged to bring their best finds to our next TGRC meeting on Wednesday, October 15 th at 7:00 PM. You won't find a more appreciative group to help celebrate your success!

As the Club's biggest source of funding, revenue from Treasures Unearthed keeps the Club operating all year long. Sincere thanks are owed to everyone who pitched to make this year's event so rewarding. TGRC members can share the satisfaction of a real accomplishment. 


